Dear Parents and Caregivers

We are excited to share a **host of positive changes for the 2025 school year** that will enhance both the academic and extracurricular experiences of our students. Across the school, we are **expanding our curriculum** with new subjects, including VET Animal Care, Certificate 2 in Digital Technologies, and Certificate 2 in Tourism, alongside a range of new TASC courses like Ancient History and Australia in Asia and the Pacific. We are also **introducing exciting opportunities** such as the University Connections Program in Object Design, Sport and Recreation Management, and a MacKillop Construction Skill Set program with the Tasmanian Building Group Apprenticeship Scheme. In addition, Year 10 students will benefit from the **introduction of an explicit study skills course** to better prepare them for Years 11 and 12, while **Year 8 students will enjoy a more flexible and enriched curriculum** with subjects like Textiles and Digital Art (Media), as well as more choice in their learning journey.

To further support our students, we are **investing in new pathways**, including a Senior School trip to New Zealand and an exciting sports facility upgrade, which will include new cricket nets, AFL goal posts, extra basketball courts (3v3) and handball courts. We are also **enhancing student support** with the employment of a full-time study supervisor and sports coordinator, as well as continuing to foster a positive and inclusive environment through our Positive Behaviour Protocols and authentic student leadership opportunities. We are committed to ensuring the 2025 school year is one of growth, opportunity, and success for all our students.

The College **continues to responsibly manage expenditure** so to minimise and fairly charge fees. For 2025 the College general tuition fees are increasing by 5%. Catholic Education Tasmania has approved the addition of a capital contribution fee per family as consistent across the system. Due to the increasing costs associated with the significant activities undertaken in Outdoor Education we have had to re-introduce the levy for these elective subjects. Similarly with the increasing costs associated with certifying VET qualifications we have added a flat fee for these programs. We have removed the Bible levy. Other fees and levies remain unchanged.

To say we are looking forward to 2025 would be an understatement! Have an enjoyable, restful and safe Christmas and holiday, we look forward to seeing you at MacKillop in 2025.

Family Discount

A family discount can be claimed by families with multiple children at Tasmanian Catholic schools or colleges, in accordance with the Catholic Education Commission Tasmania School Fees Assistance Policy.
The discount rate is:

3 children	10% discount on tuition fees for each child
4 children	20% discount on tuition fees for each child
5+ children	30% discount on tuition fees for each child

If claiming the family discount, please provide details of siblings at Tasmanian Catholic schools or colleges other than MacKillop Catholic College, please indicate where indicated on the Payment Arrangement Form when completing and return to the College. Enrolments may be verified with the named school or college.

Fee Assistance

Fee assistance is available for families experiencing financial difficulty.

If you would like someone from the school to contact you regarding fee assistance please indicate in the section of the Payment Arrangement Form when completing and return to the College.

Invoice Terms

Invoices will be issued to you at the commencement of the new school year. Full payment is due 30 days from the date of the invoice, unless you have made alternative payment arrangements using the Payment Arrangement Form.

Please note, even if you have previously entered into a payment arrangement in past years a new Master Payment Arrangement Form and Credit Card or Direct Debit authority **must be completed each year**.

Also note that any payment arrangement entered into is purely administrative. Notwithstanding the amount invoiced, in the event of default on payment arrangements the total amount outstanding will become immediately due. The school reserves its right to take steps to recover payment in full.

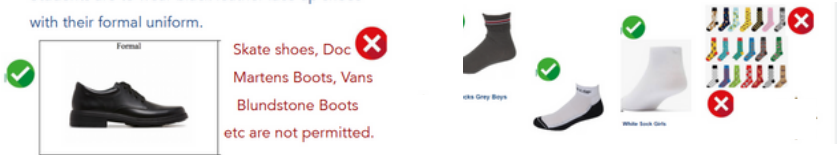

Information Communication Technology

MacKillop Catholic College provides a lease-to-own laptop model which ensures that all students have their own compatible and consistent device at the College and at home to facilitate learning.

This model enables the College to access the best bulk buy pricing and ongoing support on behalf of families. Rather than families having to purchase the device outright, the College model provides for families to 'lease' a machine over three years and then transfer ownership. New devices are provided to Year 7 and Year 10 students at the commencement of those years. Students joining the College partway through a year or 3-year cycle may be offered a second hand device for the interim period. Students leaving the college part way through a year/cycle will be able to retain their device through a 'buy-out' option and pay any additional years lease amounts.

MacKillop Catholic College is a **Microsoft Windows Operating** technology environment. As such, the College's ICT Committee recommended the continued use of the **Microsoft Surface Go** as the preferred device for students. Part of this decision included the comprehensive care program offered to the school by Microsoft.

Microsoft Complete for Schools Premium is a protection plan tailored for educational institutions. It offers coverage for up to three years and allows for up to three claims during this period.

The plan includes:

Accidental Damage Coverage:

This covers incidents like drops, spills, and cracked screens, and Mechanical Breakdown Coverage: This includes failures due to defects in materials or workmanship.

Included in the IT Charge is the annual lease payments for the device, protective cover, Microsoft Complete care, full student access to all required software (including the Microsoft Office suite), JacPLUS (the College's online text and resources) and student and parent access to SEQTA (the College's student management system).

The College has an **ICT Acceptable Use Agreement** which students and parents/caregivers are required to sign at the commencement of each school year. This agreement outlines the student's responsibilities for the following:

- Care of their laptop and responsibility for any damages which may occur,
- Care of ICT facilities,
- Appropriate use of College ICT resources,
- Appropriate use of the Internet and Internet resources, and
- Account security including not sharing passwords or attempting to access other users' accounts.





Houses

As an integral component of College spirit and College engagement MacKillop Catholic College Vertical Pastoral Care and House System strengthen students’ welfare, learning and community values. Our House System builds relationships through charism, connections and communities of care so all are assisted in growing into the fullness of life.

Deeply rooted in our Catholic identity each House has been inspired by either the tradition of Mary of the Cross MacKillop or the charism of Blessed Edmund Rice.

Each student is allocated to one of six Houses which is their MacKillop family for the entirety of their educational journey.

Within each house, students are supported by a Head of House, a Pastoral Care Teacher and senior students who have added responsibility of guiding younger students.

Our six Houses are:
Fitzroy, Penola, Rice, Sion, Tenison and Waterford

Your child’s Pastoral Care Teacher is your first point of contact for ANY queries or concerns you may have regarding your child.

Absence

HOW TO REPORT AN ABSENCE

The preferred method of reporting an absence from school is through our College SEQTA Engage App or through the SEQTA Engage parent web portal.

HOW IT WORKS

The Parent Notified Absences feature allows parents using the SEQTA Engage App to log absence notifications direct with the College on their mobile device. This can be through the SEQTA Engage App or through the SEQTA Engage parent web portal.

These absence notifications allow parents to notify the College when their child will be absent, whether it's for that day or a future date.

Within 'New Absence'

- The ability to submit a new notification of an absence from their mobile device without having to contact the College in any other way
- The ability to submit a notification of absence for today, or any date into the future. Submissions for dates in the past are not possible.

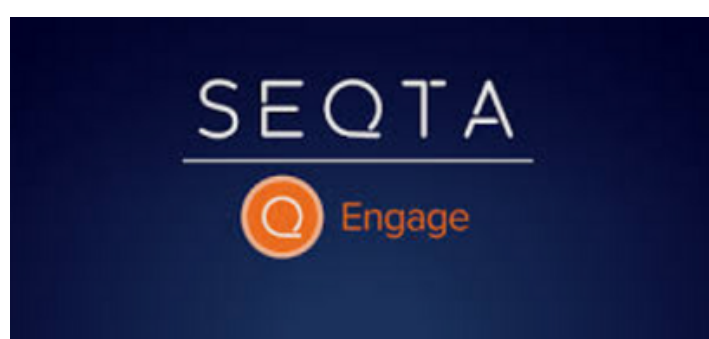
However, lodging a notification of an absence starting before the present moment but on Today's date is possible. For example, submitting an absence for the day, at 8:45am when the school day started at 8:00am, is possible.

A request can only be submitted for one child at a time. If parents/guardians have multiple children at the same SEQTA school, they will need to submit a new request for each child's absence.

- Recurring absences cannot be submitted with this feature.
- Parents must choose a Reason for the absence from the list provided.
- Parents have a Comment box in which additional information can be portrayed to the school.

Previously our method of absentee notification was by either email notification and the online form through the College website however this will be phased out from the commencement of 2025.

CAR DROP OFF AND PICK-UP

The College Office is located off Goondi Street, and we recommend this street as a drop-off and pick-up point. Driving through the driveway in front of the College Office is permissible but this is not a parking space. You may stop and collect a waiting student here. This is a one way thoroughfare.

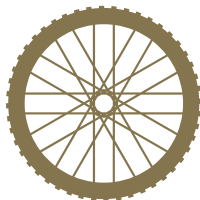
Currajong Street is particularly busy during drop-off and pick-up times due to the presence of buses. We therefore request that families choose drop-off and pick-up points that are alternative to Currajong Street. Currajong Park is a good alternative. From 2025 the College will open a path from Currajong Park leading onto the oval.

The College car parks within the grounds via Currajong Street are for staff only.



MORNINGTON ROUNDABOUT

This is a dangerous roundabout and we ask students not to attempt to cross it on foot for any reason.



CYCLING / SCOOTER TO SCHOOL

Students who cycle or scooter to school have a provision for the storage of their bike or scooter. Please park your bike at the rear of the College Reception in the undercover area. We remind students who choose to cycle or scooter to school to wear their helmets and follow all road rules.

The College is a high traffic area during peak drop off and pick up times.



BUS INFORMATION

Most students travel to the College by bus and services are available from most areas. Information is available on the College website.

Students who catch buses after school should line up in the designated area in groups according to which bus they catch. Students board buses only when directed to do so by teachers on duty.

SEQTA Engage app is the most important parent app at MacKillop College. 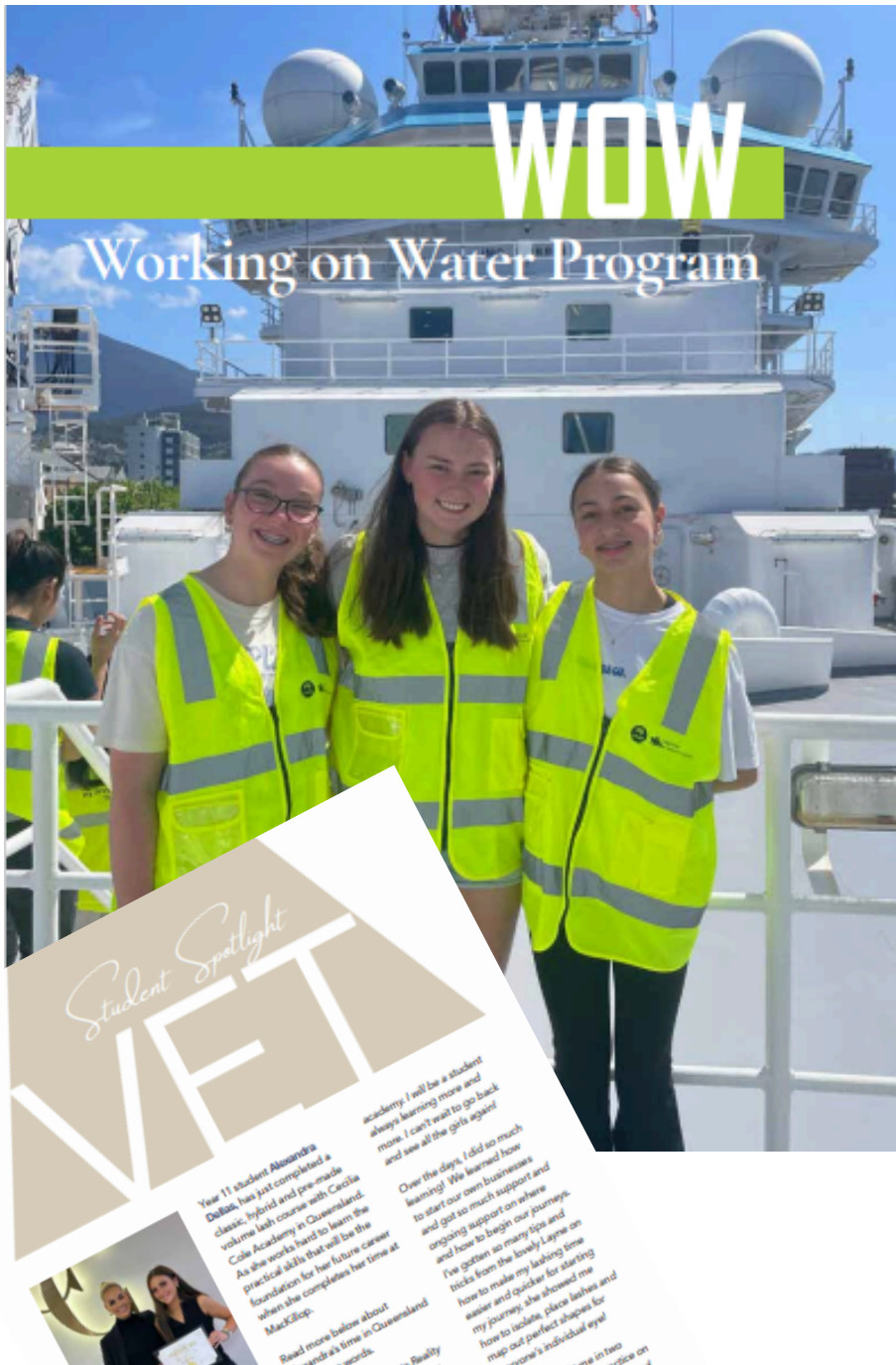
